Background

Wingham Parish Council reviewed their dog fouling practices after experiencing dog fouling in Wingham's open spaces and footpaths. The implementation of the stations came about after conversations with Dover District Council whom already had stations with Eco Green Communities around the district.

The three environmental stations were erected with the help of local business sponsorship.



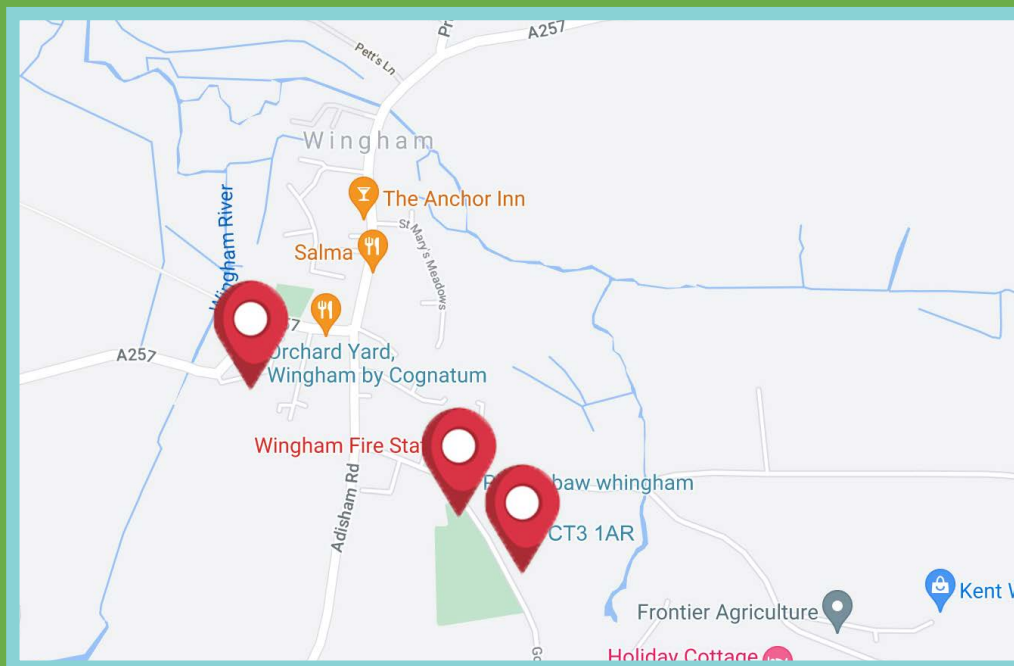

The locations

The locations were chosen by the council in line with the 'hot-spots' where dog fouling was becoming an issue. The other locations were identified by high footfall areas and popular dog walking locations.



Results and future plans

Initial reports show that the **100% compostable bags** are used up quickly by residents in Wingham. The dog fouling stations have **received positive feedback** from residents.
